- ✝ With all the trauma in our lives here in Siteki these days, the security situation is our first-mentioned concern. Not only have our neighbors, the Taylors, been attacked, and their home burglarized, but a number of other strikes against people in the mission station have been made. It has been especially unnerving when the attacks have come twice on our white Canadian neighbors. But the casual way in which life and property is being threatened makes us feel there is a demonic source to all this. So we'd first like you to pray that the *perps be apprehended* and that there will be enough solid evidence to try them in the courts of justice and find them guilty. The college and mission are trying to respond appropriately as regards increased security measures as well as a prayer shield around us.
- ✝ The second item of concern is the ongoing need for revival here at the college and in the Swazi Nazarene church. There should be a "sweeping revival" every generation, I believe, to keep the Church focused on her task of being Christian, holiness and missional! It's time for Swaziland.
- ✝ The third item regards the need for wisdom in dealing adequately with the changing needs of aging parents and relatives, both Evelyn's dad and his sister, and my parents, as well as our children, who are young adults, and even one, a parent. We continue to feel very far away and incapable of informed responses.
- ✝ I'm also concerned about my home district. You're all such great people that maybe this doesn't make sense. But I've been watching the numbers on the daily prayer updates that DS Smith sends out, and in far too many places across western Washington the church no longer seems to be advancing. If the denomination at its historical source isn't winning people to Christ and discipling them into the church, can we expect the mission churches to be much different?

- ✚ Jon and I spent the month of February upcountry, traveling to some of the most distant, and hard-to-get-to teaching points in the northern and central provinces. We were teaching and delivering new pieces of equipment for the JESUS Film teams. When Jon gets all of the pieces of equipment brought in from South Africa, there will be one set of equipment for each of the ten provinces.
- ✚ Hence, one prayer request is for the spiritual success of the ten teams who use the Film, success in actually planting a new church/team.
- ✚ Another is for the follow-through discipleship, that those evangelized would become church persons. This process needs to have trainers willing to teach in local centers (TEE centers). In order for that to function, we need partners who will undertake \$12 or \$15/month for

a minimal thank-you for the trainers who are volunteering so sacrificially. We need 15 such sponsor/partners.
